Introduction One of the first things you might consider is to check to see if there is a recent book that covers the OS/400 system in depth. There are certainly those written in the past which are still valid, and which could be useful references, but I don't know of any recent ones. I would suggest looking at [The Beginner's Guide to OS/400: Understanding the Data Base Version 7.0](#), by Bob DuCharme (see References). It was written by one of the best-known system writers, and it's based on a number of sources, so it's a good starting point, and at first glance it doesn't seem to be too dated. Before you can do anything else, you have to understand how the base system works, and this chapter is devoted to that. This chapter is important because it introduces you to the general way the OS/400 system works. It may help you to understand the "Why?" behind a lot of the specific choices made by IBM in their systems. One other thing before we get started is that you have to realize that, while OS/400 has some similarities to other operating systems, it is in no way a UNIX operating system. It has much less power, can be much more difficult to use, and has a much greater learning curve. This is one of the reasons there are so many books and articles about OS/400; there are many people who don't want to learn it and are looking for a good sales job instead. We are not trying to be "holier than thou" here; you have to make up your own mind about which operating system you are going to learn. When we talk about OS/400, we are simply describing what is available, how to configure it, and why some choices are made as they are. Now let's get started. Linux is just a hobby for me. I run an OS/400 shop, and I have been using IBM's software products for almost 30 years. I have studied all of the IBM OS/400 operating systems, from V7R1 through OS/400 V7R5, and I have used all of the IBM software on the system over the years. I am well versed in their strengths and weaknesses. When you are ready to go home, you will probably have a lot of questions about OS/400, and you may also be tempted to start running, which is not a good idea.
